

Complaint of Reprisal

The form should be used to submit a complaint of reprisal.

Under section 36(1) of the Act, no person shall take or direct a reprisal against a public servant or former public servant because the public servant has, in good faith:

- a) Sought advice about making a disclosure from the designated officer or permanent head of the government institution which he or she is employed or the commissioner;
- b) Made a disclosure
- c) Co-operated in an investigation pursuant to this act; or
- d) Declined to participate in wrongdoing

If a public servant or former public servant alleges that a reprisal has been taken or directed against him or her, the public servant or former public servant may make a written complaint to the Public Interest Disclosure Commissioner respecting the matter.
