Key Responsibilities of position:

Reporting to the Executive Director: Saskatchewan Ballistics Lab, the Firearms Lab Technician will be responsible for receiving, documenting, and preparing firearms-related evidence such as ammunition, casings, and firearms, while rigorously maintaining chain-of-custody records to ensure evidentiary integrity throughout the investigative process. A critical part of your role is to calibrate, operate, troubleshoot, and conduct preventative maintenance on specialized instrumentation, including comparison microscopes, digital imaging systems, and other tools in accordance with the laboratory's quality assurance and control procedures. You will compile and synthesize analytical results into clear, concise technical reports for review by firearms analysts, law enforcement, and legal counsel, and support the preparation of expert testimony for court proceedings under supervision. The incumbent will be appointed as a Special Constable pursuant to The Police Act, 1990.
